3. Which are the purposes we pursue and the legislative regulations we have to observe when processing your personal data?

4. To which persons and institutions do we forward your data?

5. Do we transfer data to Third Countries?

We do not transfer any personal data to
third countries.

6. How long do we store your data?

We store your personal data for the duration of the project or until you revoke your consent.

7. Consequences resulting from non-provision of your personal data?

If you wish to participate in the project we need to know your first name, your surname and your postal address, the indication of your e-mail address and your date of birth is not mandatory.

8. What are your rights?

You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. The withdrawal of your consent will not affect the lawfulness of processing based on your consent before its withdrawal.

You have the right to request information on the exact personal data we are processing about you (Art. 15 GDPR). If the data in question is incorrect or incomplete, you may demand rectification (Art. 16 GDPR). You have the right to have your data erased, provided that certain conditions are met (Art. 17 GDPR). You may also, under certain conditions, request that the processing of your personal data will be restricted (e.g. if you dispute the accuracy of your data and clarification in this regard is not possible) (Art. 18 GDPR). You may object, on grounds relating to your particular situation, to the processing of your personal data concerned, unless there is an overriding public interest in the processing which overrides the interests, rights and freedoms of the person concerned, or the processing is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defense of legal claims (Article 21 GDPR).

9. Right of Complaint

Every person concerned has the right to lodge a complaint with the Rhineland Palatinate State Commissioner for Data

Protection and Freedom of Information, if he/she believes that his/her personal data are being processed unlawfully.
